

Medical Malpractice Settlements

Eastern Pennsylvania, August 2005

Claim against midwives and hospital nurses for failure to timely perform a C-section alleging causation of cerebral palsy of newborn.

Eastern Pennsylvania, August 2005

Claim by a sixty-five year old woman for amputation of leg above knee following knee replacement surgery.

Pennsylvania, August 2005

Claim against neuro-surgeon that he damaged nerves during operation for removal of cancerous tumor.

Eastern Pennsylvania, August 2005

Claim involving death of middle aged man during brain surgery.

Pennsylvania, August 2005

Death claim for failure to provide sufficient oxygen for young man.

Central Pennsylvania, July 2005

Case involving death of a six month old child alleging failure to diagnose and treat a bowel perforation.

Eastern Pennsylvania, July 2005

Allegation that a baby died as a result of the physician failing to diagnose "Big Baby" and failing to perform a cesarian section in a timely manner.

Western Pennsylvania, July 2005

Claim against surgeon for improper placement of a PICC line in a teenage boy during an appendectomy, causing a slight stroke.

Central Pennsylvania, June 2005

Claim alleging surgeon performed hysterectomy unnecessarily and improperly on 28 year old woman.

Central Pennsylvania, April 2005

Claim against physician alleging negligence in failing to recommend appropriate cancer screening tests for seventy-four year old male. Additional claim filed against surgeon alleging he negligently ligated both ureters during the surgery causing lengthy post operative course and numerous complications. Case involved both wrongful death and survival actions

Pennsylvania, April 2005

Claim alleging radiologist failed to diagnose congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH). Sonogram showed that child should have been delivered by cesarean with a team available for surgery. This resulted in permanent cognitive disability in the child including blindness.

Western Pennsylvania, April 2005

Claim against physician for failure to fully and properly remove cancer polyp of the colon of a sixty-nine year old woman.

Western Pennsylvania, April 2005

Claim by parents against physician and nurse claiming improper delivery by inappropriate fundal pressure and excessive force or improper McRoberts and Woods Screw Maneuvers. Child suffered a permanent shoulder dystocia. There was no cognitive disability as a consequence of fetal hypoxia/anoxia.

Western Pennsylvania, April 2005

Claim against hospital alleging child lost one kidney due to nurse improperly removing sutures, causing infection following treatment. Defendant admitted liability and causation.

Eastern Pennsylvania, April 2005

Claim for failure to timely diagnosis and treat bleeding in post-partum 39 year old female, resulting in permanent injuries and loss of employment. Two physicians consented to settle and the hospital and one physician were dismissed from case without contribution.

Central Pennsylvania, March 2005

Mediation after summary of action motion was granted for plaintiff on liability and causation against physician for improper penal implant operation.

Virginia, 2005

Claim by an elderly woman alleging pharmacy failed to properly monitor administration of powerful drug resulting in permanent injuries including vertigo.

Allegheny County, February 2005

Claim against doctor for failure to diagnose and treat lung cancer in forty-eight year old man.

Dauphin County, February 2005

Claim that the emergency room and orthopedic surgeon failed to diagnose and treat arm fracture of a young boy.

Chester County, February 2005

Claim involving an elderly man who suffered cognitive impairment affecting his ability to communicate when the wrong dosing protocol for heparin was administered.

Allegheny County, February 2005

Claim by a fifty five year old man involving failure to recognize and treat complications from back surgery, which resulted in permanent disability and inability to work.

Montgomery County, February 2005

Claim by a forty year old man on behalf of himself and his two twin daughters for wrongful death fo his wife based on failure to treat and diagnose sepsis.

Lancaster County, February 2005

Claim of a young mother involving permanent injuries of baby suffering birth trauma. Claiming failure to recognize fetal distress which delayed delivering by cesarian.

Allegheny County, February 2005

Claim involving the delay in diagnosis and treatment of cancer in the neck of a fifty five year old professional.

Cumberland County, February 2005

A young mother alleging physician failed to deliver cesarian, which resulted in permanent injuries of baby.

Montgomery County, December 2004

Claim involving a one year delay in diagnosis of breast cancer of female married to staff physician at institution. Allegation that radiologist defaced earlier slide to cover up admission.

Allegheny County, December 2004

Claim involving the death of a young child who was incorrectly diagnosed with stomach problem when he had a bowel obstruction which resulted in infection and death.
